265 & 266 Eosinophilic granuloma/plaque. Lesions may occur on the skin or within the oral cavity. Red, granulomatous nodules with a necrotic-looking surface on the medial surface of the fore and hindlegs. The lesions are very pruritic.

267 Eosinophilic granuloma/plaque. Large granulomatous lesions on the ventral abdomen, which had appeared at the site of an ovariohysterectomy incision. The condition recurred twice after surgical excision of the lesion but responded rapidly and permanently to combination corticosteroid-progestogen therapy. Note the moist appearance and the brown staining of the fur due to the cat's constant licking.
